Supporting young engineers

Through its charity, the Engineers Trust, the Company donates in the order of £100,000 every year to a wide range of awards and prizes, primarily for younger engineers and apprentices.

Further details of the nineteen schemes are available on the Company website; examples include:

- Sponsoring and mentoring 20 students who may face, or have faced, challenges and obstacles in their careers, through the Engineering Horizon bursary scheme of IET.
- Army, Royal Navy and Air Force Engineering Officers and Other Ranks of the Year Awards, for outstanding engineering contribution and leadership.
- The Cadzow Smith Award to encourage business enterprise in young engineers.
- Supporting the Royal Academy of Engineering's MacRobert Award.

Membership

There are two categories of membership of the Company – the Freedom and the Livery.

The Freedom. Members of the Freedom are Chartered Engineers registered with the Engineering Council UK (EC UK), or registered with such other overseas regulatory bodies whose standards for professional engineers are accepted by EC UK, and are approved by the Court of Assistants. There are reduced rates of Quarterage (the annual subscription) for Freemen below the age of 50, with the lowest rates for Freeman under 30.

The Livery. Members of the Livery hold the Freedom of the Company and of the City of London and are Fellows of the Royal Academy of Engineering or Fellows of an approved Professional Engineering Institution.

Associates. The Company offers a informal association to all winners of awards and prizes, initially without requiring any financial outlay. This provides ongoing access to mentoring and the opportunity to attend Company events at subsidised rates.


